

BCU Moderate Water Endorsement Assessment

What does 'non-interventionist' mean? It means you don't need to get stressed about your assessment. We'll just paddle with you for a day and that's all we need to see. There's no role play, no jumping through hoops and no simulating pretend situations: we'll just enjoy a day on the river with you, share a bit of knowledge and finish it with a full, comprehensive debrief

Depending on water levels, we might use the Dart, Tavy or Walkham on Dartmoor or the Exe or Barle in Mid-Devon. Over the day we'll also expect you to provide a safe learning environment for your learners, providing them with added value and ensure their coaching needs are identified, targeted and meet. We use the standard BCU syllabus and we aim to cover the following:

Day 1

- We'll watch you in 2 practical coaching session.
- We'll check out your personal paddling ability.
- We'll test out your knowledge with some theory questions.
- We'll check out your kit.
- We'll have a look at your on-the-water leadership skills.
- We'll watch your trip planning.
- We'll give you a full and comprehensive de-brief

Pre-requisites

- Stamped & Completed CR form authorising for assessment
- Current comprehensive BCU membership card
- Completed MWE Portfolio along with log book evidence as outlined in the Syllabus
